
Ten years ago, a single mom moved to Canby for work. "I was starting over with a new job and new to town and had absolutely nothing," she recalls. "The Canby Center helped me. You shared clothing with my son and me, helping build my confidence and hope for this fresh start. Thank you!"

Can you imagine restarting your life like this? It's not easy but it can start with a simple act of sharing. At The Canby Center (TCC), we share hope with youth and families through personal connections. Guided by faith, community, and dignity, we go beyond sharing immediate help to offer long-term support that fosters lasting growth. Our mission is straightforward: in God's love, we renew dignity and inspire learning for youth and families. With a commitment to personal responsibility, participants take steps toward a more abundant life.

In 2024, sharing hope took many forms:

- We shared no-cost food and clothing with the community every week.
- We shared backpacks and school supplies with 423 students to start the school year with confidence.
- We shared opportunities for adults to develop personal finance and English conversation skills.
- We shared a deep investment in the lives of 14 middle school mentees.
- We shared a love of learning with 160 students through reading and subject tutoring.
- We shared relationship-building experiences where parents and children learn and create together, strengthening family bonds.

We also share love and, when appropriate, pray for individuals' concerns of life. In 2024, TCC was blessed by 542 volunteers who shared 12,950 hours – each minute an offering of hope. And we're growing so that we can share even more! Our expanding facility and programs will enable us to meet the needs of an increasing number of working poor families in our area.



I've seen hope shared in innumerable ways. Whether I'm serving side by side with my daughter or forging a friendship with a lonely man fallen on hard times, every act of sharing produces one thing above all: hope. This shared hope is the result of our partnership with you. Thank you!

SHARING SPACE

During construction, local partners ensured The Canby Center's essential programs continued with minimal interruption by sharing their spaces. Thank you!

- Canby Evangelical Church welcomed our eight-week Summer Book Club.
- Canby Police Department incorporated our Back to School backpack and supplies distribution into their community block party.
- St. Patrick Catholic Church was a satellite location for our twice-weekly Harvest Share food distributions.
- Christ the King Church hosted our annual pumpkin painting event.
- Canby Christian Church opened their doors for our Community Christmas event.



GIVING TOGETHER

Together, The Canby Center achieved remarkable impact through collaborative efforts and dedicated supporters whose creativity and ingenuity bring our mission to life.

- Friendsgiving Golf Fundraiser hosted by Willamette Valley Country Club gathered support for the Backpack Buddies program.
- Local businesses collected backpacks, coats, toys, and bikes that were distributed to families hit hardest by economic pressures.
- Cutsforth's Market championed our holiday food drives, collecting 220 turkeys to share with families through our Harvest Share food program.
- Canby High School Culinary Arts class prepared a weekly community meal served by The Canby Center at no-cost.
- George Fox University nursing students developed community health perspectives while serving alongside staff and volunteers for 360 hours.
- Christmas in Canby's 5K walk/run fundraiser brought the community together, with all proceeds donated to help close our fiscal year strong.
